EXPANSION PLAN TO BE PICKLED ?

Yet again the most important issue affecting Collingtree this month is the possible large scale housing development between the village and East Hunsbury. A new announcement by Communities Secretary Eric Pickles seems to create more confusion.

For over four years, the West Northamptonshire Joint Planning Committee has been trying to push through a major expansion strategy that would allow building on Greenfield sites, mainly around Northampton Borough. Included in this is the so called SUE N0.5 site in this area. It was claimed then that local councillors had no choice and that housing targets were set by national government and the East Midlands Regional Strategy.

The WNJPC is made up of the three councils of Daventry, South Northants and NBC and although it is a body that nobody voted for, it has a great influence on local decisions. The WNJPC expansion strategy provoked a great opposition when first launched and since a change of government and a move towards more 'Localism', the housing targets have been reduced. However, many feel that 'Localism' has turned out to mean very little and residents affected by planning policies have little real say.

BUT I Eric Pickles has now announced that he is scrapping the East Midlands Strategy with the aim of giving more control to local communities. He said "*the flawed top-down targets of regional planning built nothing but resentment*". The decision will take effect on 12th April.

This means that Northampton Borough and its Planning Committee will now be

totally responsible what gets built and where. The concern remains however that where a Local Plan is not yet in place (as in Northampton) then Developers will still be able to get planning consent by going to appeal. However, Eric Pickles says "*even where there is no local plan, new development will still have to conform to the framework, which clearly sets out that it must be well located, well designed and sustainable*"

Countryside campaigners have asked that local councils be given a further twelve months to complete their Local Plans.

A Planning Inspector is yet to start an Inquiry into the WNJPC Strategy (begins 16th April) and how far he will take on board the Eric Pickles announcement is unclear. Local Parish Councils and Residents Groups, will tell the Inspector that the SUE No 5 site is unsustainable for large scale housing development.

Proposals by Bovis to build 1,000 plus houses on the SUE N05 site, were on show at Hunsbury Library recently but as yet no planning application has been made. On 2nd April, Northamptonshire Archaeology will start digging inspection trenches on parts of the site on 2nd April and continue for three weeks.

As a last resort in the event of the SUE N05 site being approved - it may be possible to persuade the Inspector to accept a more limited development. An alternative proposal has been suggested by local parishes and councillors and a questionnaire/survey has now been delivered to households in the village. **The survey can be completed online at: www.HCRA.co.uk**

COLLINGTREE PEOPLE - JAMES HERVEY

Just inside the doorway of St Columba's is a list of Rectors of the Parish going back to 1241

In 1752 the Rector was James Hervey and his father, William Hervey, had been Rector before him for 16 years - and before him, his grandfather had also been Rector. In those days Collingtree formed part of a living along with the Parish of Weston Favell.

James was born at Hardingstone in 1714 and after studying law at Oxford University, he joined the Oxford Methodists and came under the influence of Charles and John Wesley. He

was ordained as a Deacon in 1733 and spent some time as his father's Curate based at Weston Favell but no doubt preaching at Collingtree. He then moved away from Northamptonshire and began a life of theological writing and became in his day very influential. His Christian imagery inspired the artist William Blake.

Through his writing he became identified with a religious view that saw 'faith' as the best way to gain holiness rather than a strict following of the 'methods' set out in the Bible. This caused a rift with the Wesley's which continued for the rest of his life.

When his father died in 1752, James succeeded to the Collingtree and Weston Favell living (then worth £160/180 a year) and took over as Rector until his death in 1758.
