SCRAPBOOK MEMORIES

A recent survey by the location website Rightmove produced a league table of the happiest places to live in Britain. Localities were measured on the following factors: neighbourliness, cost, recreation, amenities, safety, space, contentment, value, investment, decor, well-being and pride.

No such survey has been done for Collingtree but based on a series of detailed Scrapbooks going back sixty years, the village and parish would score highly.

The scrapbooks, largely inspired by members of the Women's Institute, were produced first in 1953 and then in 1965, 1977 and 1982 now are in the keeping of the County Records Office at Wootton Hall Mereway - 01604 362513

They provide a unique record of how people lived, the interests they had, the weather they experienced; the clothes they wore and (if they were lucky) the cars they drove. Collingtree was originally a farming community and the scrapbooks even tell us what crops were grown in which fields.

Few in Collingtree can now claim to have been born and bred here but as the village and the wider area of Collingtree Park has grown, it is remarkable how many of the folk who move here, choose to stay.

So, if you have ever wondered about who might have lived in your house before you did - and what they looked like - or in the case of newer developments - what was on the land before - the answer might well be in the Village Scrapbooks.

As the population explosion of southern England continues it remains to be seen how long villages like Collingtree can survive.

The Christmas Mummers

An old tradition recorded in the scrapbooks was the Collingtree Mummers which was a group very active around 1899. Every Christmas Day and Boxing Day, members would tour the village enacting the old Christmas drama. Their main calls were always at the two 'big houses' Collingtree Grange and Courteenhall Hall. The cast of characters never changed (usually played by the same people year after year) and included Father Christmas, King Will, Beelzebub, the Doctor and a popular character called 'Big Head'.

Mummers plays go back almost a thousand years and the participants were often called 'guisers' or 'geezers' because they were disguised in elaborate costumes.

Dog Fouling - More complaints have been received about dog mess on several pavements and Black Walk in particular. There is also a specific problem along Watering Lane and round the corner to the School. New signs have been placed in several areas to try and encourage responsible dog ownership. Several dog bins are provided around the village and the cost of buying them and paying for them to be emptied on a regular basis, costs all residents quite a sum each year. It is very annoying if they are not well used and dog waste on paths used by children and parents walking to school is likely to discourage walking and lead to more car journeys.

No Cold Calling Zone - At its last meeting, as a response to several complaints, the Parish Council agreed to make an order banning Cold Calling in the Parish and erect suitable notices. These are aimed at deterring cold callers but may not totally prevent them. Parishioners should be aware that anyone trying to sell at the door must have an identification that can be checked. Should any caller not appear genuine or become intimidating or threatening, the local Safer Community Team should be contacted on 03000 111 222. Even if you feel safe and secure, please make the call to help safeguard those more vulnerable. Exceptions to the cold calling ban are charitable/community calls, such as

poppy selling, charity bags or carol singing. Trick or Treating is not expected as it is considered as a form of personal begging and can appear threatening to some folk.
