# HOW COLLINGTREE VOTED

Over 40 years ago the row was over whether we edly shown through history." should join what was then the Common Market - which most of the public understood to be a straightforward Trading Agreement.

The pro's and con's were hammered out in towns and villages all over the country and Collingtree was no exception. In 1971 the Heath Government had just produced a White Paper promoting entry and a booklet, summarising the issues, was delivered to every household in the land.

A key message in the White Paper was that 'there was no question of Britain losing essential sovereignty'.

Following the distribution of the booklet, the Chronicle & Echo visited Collingtree and other villages, to test local opinion. These are some of the comments they published:

Miss W, a younger voter from the High Street said: " I am all for joining the Common Market. Germany and France are harder working nations than Britain and they see the benefits of their labours." Another high Street voter Miss C, was equally forthright: " I am a staunch Conservative so I support entry."

Mr E, of Toms Close said: " I don't think it is going to do us any good. Everything will go up in price, especially the things people really need like butter, eggs etc. I am against it."

Britain should have with the EU, rages on thought relations would be difficult: "The people in this country have never really got along with the continentals and this is repeat-

> A Mr H, was sceptical about the governments White Paper: " So many issues have been evaded that it makes people suspicious. The question of sovereignty is bound to come up in the future and I don't swallow what they say about it never arising."

> Overall, at the end of the Chronicle & Echo poll, the residents of Collingtree were in favour of being in the Common Market (for 96, against 56, don't know 64, don't care 8)

> In neighbouring Milton Malsor, it was the reverse result (for 124, against 172, don't know 124, don't care 36)

> When the only National Referendum ever held on the issue took place in 1975, there was a strong majority in favour of staying in the 'Common Market'.

> Over 40 years on, the EU has developed into something very different and there are few policy areas in which Brussels does not have the final say. As the EU begins to unravel and Britain attempts to negotiate a return to a Trade Agreement, another Referendum now seems a possibility - maybe.

> Politicians of all parties will be recalling the words of Abraham Lincoln: "You can fool some of the people some of the time-but you can't fool all of the people all of the time."

## Local plans unfold

The expansion plan (Joint Core Strategy) backed by Northampton Borough Council, has now been sent to the Planning Inspectorate.

The ICS includes the farmland running alongside Wootton Brook and part of the Golf Course extending up to Collingtree Village.

Objectors had argued that this site should be excluded because of concerns over flooding. Traffic and pollution.

**Highway Matters** More repairs to local roads were planned by NCC during January but the snow has caused delay.

**Planning Matters** There has been no further news on the Park & Ride proposal, or the tidying up of the lay-by on the A45 near the Collingtree turn.

Some will be aware that the Golf Club has contacted its members to say that some planning moves are likely to take place in March. Plans have still not been submitted but surveyors have been noted on the land to the west of Barn Corner and Black Walk. The Parish Council together with Wootton and East Hunsbury PC and the Hunsbury and Collingtree Residents Alliance, has submitted to NBC a statement of local concerns relating to the SUE No5 Expansion site. There are now going to be meetings during January and February for councillors to attend. Parishioners were promised a public meeting when any planning application arose and it may be that the next Parish Council meeting on 13th March will become a public meeting. Please watch for announcements in the Newsletter, notice-boards and on the Just Collingtree website.

**Public Awards** The idea was suggested to the Parish Council of giving some form of Parish Award for local people who had done special things for the community. This did not find favour at the last meeting as it was thought likely to be divisive as so many people do special things for this community. Northampton Borough Council does run an annual awards scheme that could be used for this purpose if anyone so wishes to make nominations to it.

### **Neighbourhood Planning**

Part of the government's revision of the Planning system is a move to encourage 'localism' whereby local residents have a greater say in development proposals that affect their area.

Wootton & East Hunsbury Parish Council and Collingtree Parish Council, assisted by local councillors, are producing a Neighbourhood Plan.

This specifically relates to the proposed development site (SUE No. 5) on farmland alongside Wootton Brook and extending over part of the Golf Course up to Collingtree Village.

If, after a Public Inquiry, approval for development is given, the Neighbourhood Plan would seek to minimise the impact and propose better traffic and environmental solutions.

The views of residents in both Hunsbury and Collingtree, on the Neighbourhood Plan, will be sought in coming weeks.
