The AGM of the Council was held on 8th May, followed by a normal meeting. The Council membership continues as before with Mr Malcolm Brice as Chairman and Mrs Trini Crake as Vice-Chairperson. The meeting agreed the figures to go before the Independent Internal Auditor and then the national external auditors.

Planning Matters (Tom's Close) At the last PC meeting a developer attended to explain plans to put 2 blocks of semi -detached houses on the southwestern corner of Tom's Close. He explained that one corner block of 2 would be in stone to match those in Watering Lane and the other 2 would match existing houses in Tom's Close. This was queried by a resident who claimed that there was a possibility of houses in Tom's Close, being demolished. Neither the Parish Council or our local Borough Councillor, Michael Hill had heard of this and Councillor

Hill has since confirmed that there is no intention to knock down houses in Tom's Close or develop any more land in that area. The Northampton Borough Council (NBC) intention is to use No 17, due to be vacated, to test their ideas about better insulation and heating for those houses. The PC decided that portakabins could not be sited on the Playing Field during the summer while this work went on. There was concern at the meeting that the new houses on Tom's Close could add to the existing parking problems as there could be 16 new residents. The developer pointed out that there would be 2 off-road spaces to each house. The PC will make observations on the plans but anyone who wishes to object should give their views direct to NBC by Email or letter. The lack of a footpath on one side of Tom's Close and dropped kerbs onto Watering Lane was also raised. Councillor Phil Larratt has discussed this with Andrew Leighton of NCC and dropped kerbs will be installed both on Tom's Close and three areas on Ash Lane.

(Barn Corner) whilst news of any development often causes alarm, it is good to note that extensions can be done well and in keeping with their surroundings. A case in point is the extension on Barn Corner where K2 Construction have done an excellent job and with great care have extended the house and yet retained its essential appearance.

(Golf Course development) There have been no further moves and a site visit by the Planning Inspector has yet to be arranged. Watch out for announcements in the Newsletter and notice boards
