



Major Development Proposal at Junction 15 - The hard questions.

Property developer Roxhill has joined with Courteenhall Estates to promote a 2m sq ft National Distribution Centre for kitchen manufacturer Howden's, on farmland adjoining Junction 15.

The development will be double the size of Howden's existing Distribution Centre at Brackmills. In 2013 its fleet of 90 HGV's delivered 90,000 loads to its 559 depots every week.

The consultation leaflet delivered to households in the area failed to mention Collingtree on its location map. An exhibition of site plans was held at the Hilton Hotel on 16th July and details from this are on website www.northampton-gateway.co.uk/howdens.

As with all planning proposals there will be many pros and cons but most of the hard questions have yet to be answered:

are having to import more and more of our food?

- How does this site fit with the Strategic Plan for the area which currently identifies more sustainable sites with access to Junction 16?
- With the M1 corridor already exceeding Air Quality limits, how will emissions from the additional vehicles using the site be controlled?
- The proposal offers to provide 'significant improvements to the existing problems at Junction 15. Can this really be achieved by simply installing more traffic lights and widening slip roads?

Although the proposed site mainly affects Northampton, the planning application, expected later in the year, will be decided by South Northamptonshire District Council in Is it wise to build on yet more farmland when we Towcester. Comments can be sent to SNC Planning Dept.

News from Hunsbury & Collingtree Residents Alliance

Many people who have already commented or objected to the Bovis application to build 1,000 houses between Collingtree and East Hunsbury, will recently have received a further letter from Northampton Borough planners.

Bovis has now submitted revised details in an effort to deal with the queries raised by individuals and statutory bodies.

The documents are very lengthy although there are no significant changes. They can be found on

Comments should be sent to Rita Bovey at NBC Planning Dept, The Guildhall. Despite the 21 day deadline quoted, comments can be considered right up to the Planning Committee meeting—whenever that might be .

HCRA believe that the fundamental issues relating to Traffic (including air and noise pollution) and flood risk have still not been satisfactorily addressed. It is not clear from the documentation whether bodies like the Environment Agency and County Highways have endorsed the plans and everyone is still waiting for the Inspector's report on the whole principle of development of the SUE 5 site.

The three councils (NBC/SNC & Daventry) that make up the West Northamptonshire Planning Committee, held a shambolic meeting on 8th July at the Northampton Guildhall attended by 100 observers from the public. It was difficult to know what was going on because the sound system broke down. All that seemed to happen is that the Chairmanship of the WNJPC passed to South Northants Council from Daventry and the Vice Chairmanship passed to Daventry from South Northants. The Northampton Borough representatives remain sidelined even though the main impact of the proposed expansion programme falls on Northampton. More details on www.HCRA2013.co.uk
