England Expects!

Collingtree, although small, has origins as ancient as any English village.

Its history takes in Iron Age settlements, Roman occupation, Anglo Saxon culture, Norman Conquest, a bloody Civil War and threat of invasion by both French and German megalomaniacs.

Consequently, like other villages, it celebrates anniversaries and key dates that have helped define England and Britain, as a free and independent nation. Many of these dates have a special significance during 2015.

In June it was the 800th anniversary of the signing of the Magna Carta described by Winston Churchill as *'the foundation of principles and a system of government of which King John and his Nobles could never have dreamed'*.

It shaped not only England but America, the Commonwealth and much of the world, by establishing the principles of individual freedom, parliamentary democracy and the supremacy of law.

Other major anniversaries this year have celebrated the struggle to defend those founding principles. For generations of schoolboys their two outstanding heroes were the Duke of Wellington and Admiral Lord Nelson.

In June it was 200 years since the Battle of Waterloo of 1815, when, in an epic turning point, Wellington ended French ambitions to dominate Europe.

On 21st October it will be Trafalgar Day and 210 years since Nelson's crushing defeat of the French Navy in 1805. It was a victory that ensured control of the Seas by Britain and led to the defeat of Napoleon at Waterloo ten years later.

The oak built ships of the Royal Navy were known as 'The Wooden Walls of Old England' and this name was given in 1847 to the pub in Collingtree. As far as we know the only pub anywhere so named.

In recent weeks we have been celebrating 75 years since the Battle of Britain when the RAF, day after day for three months,

fought off the Luftwaffe and eventually enabled the Allies to end the German domination of Europe.

These continuing anniversaries are a reminder that whether in Collingtree or anywhere else, a nation's independence is hard won but easily surrendered.

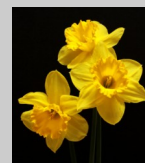

Planning matters Golf Course development

An appeal against the refusal of the Bovis applications by Northampton Borough Council has been made and will be considered by an inquiry held by a planning inspector. The start of the inquiry is planned for December. with a pre-inquiry meeting scheduled for 10am on 23rd September.

Toms Close Negotiations continue between Northampton Partnership Homes (NPH) and the individual owner-occupiers.

Playing Field matters It was reported last time that anti-bird spikes placed across the top of the swing frame to deter birds from messing on the swing seats had been pointlessly damaged. They were working well and so will now have to be replaced at a financial cost to the community - unless those who damaged them offer to pay. No offer to pay has been received. As dogs are not allowed on the playing field for child health reasons, will anybody responsible for visitors to the field please make them aware of

this rule. The field is legally covered by the Northampton Borough Council's dog ban regulations and the notices relate to Health and Safety law so any fines could be expensive.

Streetlights The streetlight outside no 1 Spinney Drive has been smashed down by what must have been a large vehicle. This happened on Friday 17th July but the vehicle has not been identified. If anyone saw this incident and knows the cause can they please contact the Clerk or Chairman. It could be that a child at the school saw what happened. The cost will be met by insurance but the excess charge might be saved if the offending vehicle can be identified. Any such incident or any faulty lights should be notified to the Parish Clerk or Chairman. It is possible for parishioners to report incidents or faulty street lights themselves if they so wish. The contact for most village lights is E.ON on 01604 493743. For Collingtree Park lights and those in Glebe Farm Close, the contact is Balfour Beatty on 0300 126 1000 option 4.

A new streetlight for Spinney Drive has been ordered and will be fitted early in August.

Trees and bushes alongside pavements As the growing season is now well under way, will all residents please continue to check that any trees or bushes alongside pavements are kept pruned back so that the full width of the pavement is clear and fully accessible. There are several wheelchair users in the village and obstruction of pavements is an offence.

Village Traffic

The speed of traffic through Collingtree Village continues to alarm residents along Watering Lane and Ash lane and anyone, especially children, trying to cross these roads. The Parish Council has been urging the County Council to come up with a sensible traffic calming scheme that includes an effective 20 mph limit. NCC has not as yet achieved this.

What would help in the short term would be improved white lining and road markings as has recently been installed in Milton Malsor. The lane separation centre line around the blind corner on Ash Lane was never replaced when the road was resurfaced some years ago. The only long term remedy is some kind of physical road narrowing, such as a 'chicane', that seems to work in other villages.

Public Footpaths

The Ramblers Association has launched a campaign to highlight and improve every public footpath in England & Wales. It is called 'The Big Pathwatch' and they want volunteers to pick a grid square on the OS Explorer maps (from their website) and walk every path in the square. The aim is then to report back to the RA on the condition of the path and any barriers. The RA will then work to sort out the problems. Volunteers can use an App on their smartphone or print a map from the website and send comments by post.

Planning Watchdog

The Appeal Inquiry into NBC's refusal of the Bovis planning application on the Hunsbury/Collingtree site, begins on 1st December.

Meanwhile a report has gone to NBC Planning Committee (28th July) advising it, on the advice of its lawyers, to amend its reasons for refusal.



This would involve removing reference to the dispute with the other Joint Planning Authorities (Daventry & South Northants) and dropping the concerns about Air Quality. This seems surprising as questions over Air Quality have increased both locally and nationally.

The grounds for refusal now largely focus on traffic on the A45 and surrounding roads. The row between NBC and the other authorities continues with Daventry once again taking the Chairmanship (and casting vote) of the West Northamptonshire Joint Planning Committee, which designated the Bovis site in the first place.
