Village Church For Sale!

Since 1960, 1,700 Anglican churches have been mothballed, closed or sold off. To survive a parish church must 1) raise funds to maintain the building structure 2) raise thousands of pounds to pay its contribution to the Anglican Church nationally 3) attract a big enough congregation and users of the church to make it viable and, vitally, 4) find the volunteers to provide the ongoing stewardship (Church Wardens PCC members etc) to hold the whole thing together.

Despite being 900 years old and the much loved heart of the village for generations—St Columba's is struggling on all these fronts. Although it is hard to imagine Collingtree without its church—it has no 'divine right' to survive when so many others are failing. As well as a place of worship, a church can be many things.

A meeting place, a concert hall, a classroom, and for many people (regardless of faith), the Parish Church is a symbol of our English identity. There are now more Mosques than Churches,

For St Columba's the problems are many. Worshippers are fewer, Diocese costs have risen to £15,000 a year, long serving wardens and officials are retiring and fewer people have the time or inclination to take on all the essential tasks. But all is not lost, there are glimmers of hope for the future—all it takes is people.

In 2011 a new 'Friends' group was formed in Collingtree to raise funds for repairs and improvements to the church fabric and the group continues to help in this vital work.

But keeping the building secure, heated and well lit is not enough. It needs to relate to the community it serves, it needs to be alive with events and activities that are new, different and vibrant, but that are still consistent with Christian values.

Perhaps you have ideas, perhaps you can help with the day to day tasks—small or large. Perhaps you might even consider assisting with the work of a Church Warden! If you feel you can help in any way, to ensure that the village church survives for the next generation—then please see the 'Want to help' panel on the next page.

Planning Watchdog

There are several major planning proposals in the pipeline that directly impact upon Collingtree.



The Bovis application to build 1000 houses on farmland near Collingtree has been with NBC for 12 months and is expected to go to the Planning Committee very shortly. Meanwhile a major new report from CPRE has revealed that nationally, there is space for over 1m homes on brownfield sites (mainly in the south east) without building on greenfields. It appears that the only inward investment Northampton seems to attract is yet more warehouses. Those warehouses already going up around Northampton, will be dwarfed in size by the proposed Howden's Distribution Centre alongside J15. At 2.2m sq ft, it will be the biggest in the world and six times that of the Pro Logis development now going up behind the Filling Station on the A45. A full planning application to South Northants District Council is expected before the end of the year and there is already strong opposition from surrounding parish councils including Collingtree, Milton Malsor, Roade, Wootton and Quinton. As the decision will be made by South Northants DC, it is to be hoped that local Northampton Borough Councillors Jonathan Nunn and Michael Hill and County Councillor Phil Larratt, will also oppose the plan on the grounds that the impact of traffic and pollution will mainly affect NBC electors.
