A Public Inquiry opens on 1st December at Franklins Gardens when a Planning Inspector will examine an appeal by Bovis against the refusal of its two planning applications.

The Developer has been trying for nine years, to build a thousand plus houses on the land locked greenfield site between East Hunsbury and Collingtree. The Bovis development would treble the size of the parish and funnel yet more traffic onto already congested residential roads and the frequently blocked A45.

Therefore the Inspector's task should be clear cut.

Northampton Borough Council has already rejected the site as a sustainable part of its expansion strategy - its Planning Committee has refused two specific applications - the development is opposed by all local councillors, both MP's, both Parish Councils and a broad alliance of residents groups surrounding the site. Recent research shows that the UK has unused brownfield sites that could accommodate over 1m new homes.

But - local councils are strapped for cash in fighting appeals. Already the threat of legal costs has forced NBC to back down on the three key issues of flood risk, traffic congestion and air pollution.

It is now left to local groups and individual politicians to make sure that the Inspector takes full account of all the issues affecting the site and listens to real life experience as well as the arguments of paid lawyers. A drive along Rowtree Road at peak hours should convince anyone!


