# COLLINGTREE NEWS

## February 2014



In August this year, the world will mark the hundredth anniversary of the outbreak of the First World War. It was a turning point in history and claimed the lives of over 16 million. Over 1m British and Commonwealth troops died confronting German aggression and almost every parish in the country was affected.

- Every year the memory of local men Hugh Palliser Friend, Ralph Copson, George Twistleton and Joseph Hillyard are honoured at a Remembrance Service and their names are listed on the Church War Memorial.
- John Palliser Friend was Rector at St Columba's throughout the conflict and a stained glass window on the north wall of the Nave commemorates his son Hugh, a 2nd Lt. in the Northamptonshire Regiment who was killed in action at St Leger, France, in 1917 - aged 20.
- In 1915 the four bells at St Columba's were augmented with a fifth tenor bell donated by the Sears family. The older bells were then recast and all the bells rehung with a new chiming mechanism. Because of the ongoing war the rehung bells were not rung again until Armistice Day 1918, when the First World War ended.

## Watch the traffic !

Ever since the M1 opened in 1959, Collingtree has lived with the impact of ever increasing traffic and has a close interest in road planning, particularly on the A45 and Junction 15. The failure to provide lighting on major roads is a big worry.

The Northamptonshire Major Road Strategy forecasts that by 2026, 60,000 vehicles a day will use the A45 link with Junction 15 and that 12% will be Heavy Goods Vehicles (HGV's). The A508 link off the junction will carry 15,000 vehicles a day.

Unsurprisingly, the section of the M1 between Junctions 15 & 16 has been declared an Air Quality Management Area (AQMA) meaning it is unlikely to meet pollution reduction targets. The main concern is nitrogen dioxide emissions from HGV's.

The Environment Act of 1995 requires all local authorities to check on air quality and where below the standard set, designate AOMA's and take measures to improve.

A proposal has been made by the Highways Agency to lower the speed limit on some sections of the motorway network, to 60 mph, to reduce both pollution and noise.

A further concern is the likely increase in the size of HGV's allowed on British roads under EU law. Draft legislation is being considered by the European Parliament that would permit lorries longer than two double decker buses (82ft) and weighing up to 60 tonnes to cross national borders.

It is to be hoped that those that represent Collingtree in government nationally and locally, are watching all this closely in their rear view mirrors.


#### Walls Whispers

#### Hunsbury & Collingtree Residents Alliance - Update

The most problematical site within the proposed Expansion Plan (Joint Core Strategy) for Northampton, is the land between Hunsbury and Collingtree known as SUE5. The problems include flood risk, traffic congestion air & noise pollution. Despite this the body responsible (West Northamptonshire Joint Planning Committee) decided at its meeting in December to endorse the plan for further consultation. All the Northampton members voted against approval and all the Daventry and South Northants members voted for. After a tied vote the Chairman, from Daventry, voted a second time to give a casting vote in favour.

It has subsequently emerged that the vote in December was invalid because proper procedures were not followed and a further meeting has now been arranged on 5th February to rerun the vote. As a further blow to the interests of Northampton, the meeting is being held in Daventry thereby making it difficult for all the objectors who spoke at the last meeting, to travel the 28 miles to do so again.

The way the WNJPC works means that decisions that have a major impact on everyday life in East Hunsbury and Collingtree are being made by councillors who were not voted for by local people and appear to be 'dumping' their own housing obligations well away from their own urban centres and on what remains of Northampton's green fields.
