

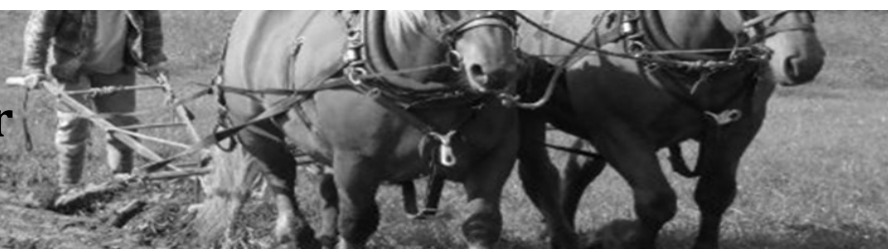

Last links with our rural past



It will be the Secretary of State and the government who will decide, later this year, whether Bovis can build a thousand plus houses on the green fields between Hunsbury and Collingtree. For most people, the major issues have always been about traffic congestion, noise and air pollution, flood risk and lack of infrastructure. At the recent Public Inquiry into an Appeal against refusal by Bovis, Northampton Borough Council left it to other objectors to raise these issues and chose to focus only on Noise from the M1 and the impact on the heritage features of Collingtree Village and its Conservation Area. Nevertheless, the expert witness used by NBC at the Appeal Inquiry, put up a pretty good case.

Ignus Froneman from. Heritage Collective argued that the Phase 1 development of 378 houses on the fields alongside Barn Corner and the Bridle Path would *'lead to serious harm both to the church of St Columba and the Conservation Area'*. He cited section 66 of the 1990 Listed Buildings and Conservation Area Act and also the new NPPF Planning framework, as reasons why the appeal should be dismissed. He produced photographic evidence to demonstrate that the fields under threat provide the last remaining link with the rural history of the village. He said the effect of the development would mean *'the comprehensive urbanisation of the field to the west of Barn Corner and the associated destruction of any ridge and furrow'* (Ridge and furrow was the method of ploughing with Oxen that goes back to Medieval times. It had the effect of pushing the land into strips of rounded mounds to produce a corrugated appearance. Northamptonshire had many surviving examples and there are several around the west of Collingtree) The heritage expert also highlighted the importance of the ancient footpath across the field which is *'an important approach to the historic village'* This was the route taken in the 18th century when a single Rector would look after both Collingtree and Milton Malsor. He claimed that the case for the destruction of these historic links with the pastoral setting of Collingtree Village had not been made.

Just how much notice the government will take of the disappearance of these links with Collingtree's past, remains to be seen.

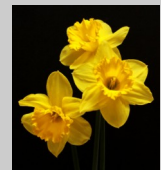

Parish finances The Parish Council decided to ask for a precept of £18,000 partly to progress its request for double yellow lines in Watering Lane. Having had complaints about near-misses, as explained in the last newsletter, the Parish Council must try to solve this problem urgently because of its duty of care to its residents.

Planning. A proposal has been made to site a road-rail interchange on land between the Northampton loop line at Milton Malsor and the land to the west of the Milton Malsor to Blisworth Road behind where Young's Nursery was situated. This would appear to cut the existing Milton Malsor to Blisworth road. This is at an early stage and the Planning Inspectorate wished to receive initial comments by 10th January.

The Parish Council duly sent its comments but was later advised, like Roade Parish Council, that the Inspectorate did not want these comments because the land is not in the parish. Our MP, Andrea Leadson, has been asked to check into this as planning comments are normally requested from adjacent parties.

However, the comments will go to the developer.

Local Parish Council Meeting An informal meeting has recently been held between a number of local Parish Councils to explore the best ways for Parish Councils to tackle difficult and contentious planning applications.

This meeting was attended by the Chairman and it was agreed to work together over applications such as the above and as part of the preparation in the next year for the Local Plan for Northampton.

Playing Field matters The playing field gate must always be left locked as this prevents any traveller incursions! Should this not be possible, or it has been left open, please notify the Parish Council Clerk. Action has been taken to have the trees to the west of the tennis courts cut back as their height is affecting light to neighbouring houses. The cost will be shared between the Parish Council and the Tennis Club.

Streetlights Any faulty lights should be notified to the Parish Council Clerk or Chairman. It is possible for parishioners to report incidents or faulty street lights themselves if they so wish by using the numbers on the lamp posts. The contact for most village lights is E.ON on 01604 493743. For Collingtree Park lights and

those in Glebe Farm Close, the contact is Balfour Beatty on 0300 126 1000 option 4.

Trees and bushes alongside pavements Will all residents please continue to check that any trees or bushes alongside pavements are kept pruned back so that the full width of the pavement is clear and fully accessible. There are several wheelchair users in the village and obstruction of pavements is an offence. If residents have problems over this, please contact the Clerk.

A new Action Group has been formed to oppose the huge Industrial Park proposed between Milton Malsor and Blisworth. It is called 'SAY NO TO RAIL CENTRAL' and has put up roadside banners and has a web-site:

A major concern is that the Developers, Ashfield Land, are seeking to bypass the local planning laws and public opinion by labelling their scheme a 'Nationally Strategic Infrastructure Project' when in reality it is just another warehouse park with some limited capability to accept rail freight.

This and other projects close to the M1 are increasingly being decided on political grounds rather than planning and it will be for voters to voice their opinion as opportunities arise.

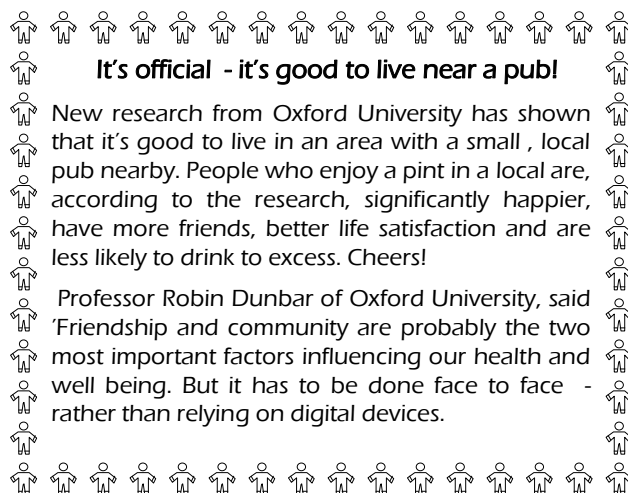
