Goodbye Toms Close ?

For the 16 tenants and owner-occupiers of Toms Close in Collingtree, these are testing times.

area because they have decided that the cost of repairing the council owned houses, is prohibitive although this is disputed. Some residents have been persuaded to move, some have no choice and some will try and stay.

Between 1945 and 1955 around 26,000 of the largely concrete 'Airey' houses were built in Britain and for many Collingtree families, Toms Close provided their first home after WW2. The road is named after the name of the old field on which it stands.

If NBC eventually do manage to clear the site it will mean that 1.031 hectares of building land is likely to be sold on to a developer. Quite how the already restricted Watering Lane will cope with at least twice the number of houses and the resultant cars remains to be seen.

Collingtree like most villages has seen many changes, but it is unusual for a whole street and its community to disappear almost overnight.

Planners told 'brownfield first'

In what seems to be a sudden U- turn by Chancellor George Osborne and Communities Secretary Eric Pickles, the Government has issued even stronger guidelines to planning authorities.

They say they will force councils to recycle 'at least 90% of suitable brownfield (previously used) sites' and will offer funding to make polluted sites more attractive to developers. This should be good news for those opposing the building of thousands of houses on greenfield sites like the farmland and open space between East Hunsbury. And Collingtree - the so called 'Sustainable Urban Extension' (SUE 5)

Government Minister Eric Pickles himself points out that ' it makes sense to have new homes in existing urban areas, where people have easy access to the jobs, shops, transport and services on offer'. Hopefully the Independent Planning Inspector will take all

this into account when he completes his report on Northampton's planning strategy in September.

County Council urged to 'come clean' on Park & Ride

Northampton Borough Council want to clear the whole of the Northamptonshire County Council (NCC) is under growing pressure to explain its plans (if any) for the agricultural land between Watering Lane and the motorway. Residents, allotment holders and users of the Hilton Hotel have complained that the once cultivated fields have become weed infested and overgrown. NCC had claimed that Silverstone had approached them asking to use the site for a Park & Ride on Race Days. Silverstone have said that they did not initiate the proposal.

> Now, local County Councillor Phil Larratt, has asked for a top level meeting of all those involved. He has written to NCC officers and Silverstone Race track pointing out that despite numerous meetings and E-mails regarding this matter, nobody is informing the community or its councillor as to what is happening regarding this land. Silverstone have said "we have registered our interest but have no immediate plans to use the site".

> An NCC officer states, "I gave Silverstone a last chance to state their intentions before looking for another agricultural tenant. They have confirmed their commitment to the site and have promised to expedite the legal formalities". These statements were made in January / February, six months ago, and nothing has moved forward. There have been approaches to NCC from farmers wanting to take on the land for agricultural purposes but they have been denied the opportunity of doing so. All that has happened is that the land has fallen into dereliction.

New life in old boxes.

The iconic 'K6' red Telephone Box in the High Street has been repainted by the 'Friends of St Columba' committee and a new Information Panel about the village has been installed inside.

The Box was purchased by the Parish Council in 2011 for £1 when BT finally took them out of service. It has been retained as a valued feature of the Village Conservation Area


