Deal or No Deal ?

Council (NCC) on Watering Lane is turning into an overgrown stone Car Park at near Whittlebury) wilderness. Silverstone has told local MP Andrea Leadsom that they have not initiated the Park & Ride idea and Collingtree Parish Council and County Councillor Phil Larratt, are also being kept in the dark. Housing plans wait for the Inspector!

Still awaited is the Independent Inspectors Report into the 'soundness' of the Joint Core Strategy for the expansion of Northampton - and also a planning decision by Northampton Borough Council (NBC) on the application by Bovis for 1,000 houses on the Collingtree/East Hunsbury site (SUE 5 Northampton South)

Bovis is waiting until the Inspector's report is published before pressing NBC for a decision. This was originally expected to be in July but may be delayed until September. Meanwhile, there is encouragement following the vote (6-2) by NBC Planning Committee on 6th May, to refuse the application to build 1,000 houses on a site at Hardingstone (SUE 6 Northampton South of Brackmills) The refusal was largely on traffic and infrastructure

issues and the impact on the A45. This could be significant as the Collingtree/East Hunsbury site has even greater traffic and environmental problems that at Hardingstone.
