# Bovis: The reasons for refusal.

Following its refusal of planning applications for the building of up to 1,000 houses on Greenfield land between East Hunsbury and Collingtree, Northampton Borough Council has now set out its reasons: These are paraphrased below:

- The development is contrary to NBC's objection to this site being included in the Joint Core Strategy.(JCS)
- The development would be contrary to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) and the JCS on Highway grounds.
- 3) The development would have unacceptable impact on residential and general amenity due to the increase in traffic on the local highway network and therefore would be contrary to NPPF and JCS.
- 4) The development is close to the M1 motorway and the noise and air quality measures proposed fail to provide a satisfactory residential 3) environment.
- 5) The development would fail to safeguard the setting of Collingtree Village and its Conservation 4) Area and would be contrary to NPPF and the JCS.

The Applicant can appeal to The Planning 5) Inspectorate within six months of the date of the refusal (2nd February 2015) although the Inspectorate does not have to allow an appeal if it considers that the Planning Authority had sound reasons for refusal.

# Howden's: The opposition grows.

The planning application to South Northants Council (SNC) for a 2.67million sq ft Distribution Centre next to Collingtree, has provoked overwhelming opposition from local communities and this is recorded on the SNC website. To date there are approaching 400 objections from individuals and their Parish Councils based on traffic issues, air and noise pollution, loss of countryside. The application from Howden's (formerly MFI) is also contrary to the JCS and Local Plans.

Technical questions have also been raised by the Statutory Agencies consulted.

- The Highways Agency state that the Transport Assessment supplied is not in line with pre application discussions and asked for a two month delay.

- The SNC Transport Officer has objected and states that the proposed improvements to J15 will not increase capacity.
- The Environment Agency have asked for evidence on the run off implications for Wootton Brook.
- The NBC Environmental Health Officer has questioned the air pollution data supplied.

The application is expected to be considered during March. See 'Parish Notices' on back page for further details of planned protests.

# Tom's Close - to the end

The planning application to South Part of the post war history of Collingtree Northants Council (SNC) for a 2.67million Village will disappear soon, if Northampsq ft Distribution Centre next to Collington Borough Council (Northampton Parttree, has provoked overwhelming opposinership Homes) gets its way.

Many of the 16 properties are now empty and those residents remaining face the threat of compulsory purchase unless they sell their homes to NBC. To obtain a CPO the Council will have to demonstrate that it is necessary for 'the public good'.

The estate is a mix of rented council rented houses and those occupied by owners who bought during the 'Right to Buy' programme of the Margaret Thatcher years. NBC argue that the cost of renovating their properties is around £80,000 (although this is disputed) and therefore wish to clear the whole site for redevelopment.

of the largely concrete 'Airey' houses were built in Britain and for many Collingtree families, Tom's Close provided a first home after WW2. A Village Scrapbook produced in 1965 has a street layout giving the names of all residents at the timefamily names that are still very much part of the history of Collingtree. The name of the road itself is taken from the old field name of 'Tom's Close' on which it stands.

If NBC do manage to clear the site it will mean, because of the large gardens provided years ago, that there will be 1.031 hectares of building land available. Quite how the already restricted Watering Lane will then cope with at least double the number of houses (and cars) remains to be seen.
