This will be the last edition of 'Collingtree News'.

It began in this format in July 2010. For many years there had been a single sheet newsletter covering the joint benefice of Collingtree, Milton Malsor and Courteenhall and when church boundaries changed, it was followed briefly by another single sheet just covering Collingtree. Since the first issue of **Collingtree News** there have been 68 editions with over 31,000 copies delivered to the 450 households in the parish, including Collingtree Park. The aim has been to promote the various voluntary groups and activities in the parish, particularly the Church (including the Village Room), the Pub, the local School and the Parish Council. All these make up the distinctive identity of Collingtree. Editorially, the focus has been on the history of the village and also highlighting the various planning and development proposals that might impact on the local community.

But times have changed. For most people 'what's on' information and news of events is better and more quickly communicated through Facebook and other social media networks, rather than by a monthly newsletter. Also, there are now many more online sources for monitoring planning proposals.

This is the time to give thanks to all those who have helped keep *Collingtree News* going over the last six years. To all those who have provided monthly updates on activities and events. To the deliverers Ann Marsh, Irene Skinner, Tom Ball, Shirley Yule, Pauline Wright, Glen Deeming, Jan Birch, Linda Croft & Jean Markie. To Ann & Mick Marsh for proof reading, usually at short notice, and helping to keep errors and omissions to a minimum. Thanks also to Eric Williamson and Sharpe Media for printing the Newsletter at a very low cost.

Collingtree News has been self financing with the print cost being covered by donations from the WI and the Parish Council and especially the much appreciated sponsorship from local firm Central Foods based at Maple Court.

Village Traffic

The speed of traffic through Collingtree Village, continues to alarm residents along Watering Lane and Ash Lane and anyone, especially children using the High Street to get to School. Successive Parish Councils have lobbied County Highways to come up with a speed reduction plan and preferably an effective 20 mph limit. As long ago as 2002 it was agreed in principle to install a mini roundabout at the crossroads giving priority to High Street traffic but the plan stalled through lack of funding. What would help in the short term would be to push the Ash Lane speed limit signs further back towards Milton Malsor and to replace the white centre lines on the blind corner. On Watering Lane, most drivers would like to see an end to the 'Russian roulette' at the top of the hill. Any further development at Tom's Close will only add to the problems.

Government policy is now to encourage 20mph limits in residential areas. A national campaign group '20 Plenty for Us' argues that all that is needed are signs at the entry and exit points and small repeater signs on lamp posts or road markings - humps and bumps are not necessary. This would be a simple solution with no costly engineering works to disrupt and deface the village. Hopefully the Parish Council will soon be able to get some action from County Highways.

EU Referendum - Time to GO?

In 2007 Collingtree was one of a handful of parishes to hold a Parish Poll on whether there should be a Referendum on membership of the EU. The overwhelming majority said that we should. Now we know that this will now happen on 23rd June. The last time the public had a say was 40 years ago when the question was about a simple 'trading agreement'. At the time the Chronicle & Echo ran an opinion survey in local villages, including Collingtree, and there was a strong majority for staying in the 'Common Market'. Now the EU has its own parliament, anthem, flag, currency and foreign policy. The question this time will be about 'who rules Britain'.

Five out of seven of the County's MP's (including Collingtree MP Andrea Leadsom) have said they will campaign to leave the EU which many feel is stuck in the past and with its many looming problems has become something of a 'sinking ship'.

Planning Watchdog

As this will be the last despatch under the 'Collingtree News' banner, here is a brief overview of the major proposals affecting Collingtree.



Bovis has appealed the refusal of its two applications to build 1000 plus houses

on greenfields between Hunsbury and Collingtree. Following an Inquiry, the Planning Inspector will report to the Secretary of State and a decision is expected in August. Meanwhile, a similar decision on 1000 houses in Hardingstone, which was due last December, has been delayed.

Proposals for the massive warehouse complex on land next to Collingtree on the south side of the M1 were withdrawn following a public outcry and Howden's pulled out as the occupier. There are still rumours that the developer Roxhill and the landowner are working on further proposals.

The proposals from Ashfield Land to establish a DIRFT style Rail Interchange between Milton Malsor & Blisworth has run into fierce objections from residents and politicians and the Dept of Transport has queried the accuracy of the site investigations. Local MP Andrea Leadsom has described the proposal as speculative rather than strategic.

What may prove to be a 'brake' on the number of large scale developments around Junction 15 and A45 is the growing concern over levels of air pollution from the traffic generated.
