

GOODBYE GREENFIELDS - HELLO TRAFFIC

Years ago, when one built up area began South Northants - is now promoting an- ough councillors, local residents and the to merge into another, it was called 'Urban Sprawl'. Now planners prefer the term 'Sustainable Urban Extensions' and one of these SUE's is planned on the remaining open space around Collingtree and East Hunsbury.

During the town expansion of the 1970's, the Northampton Development Corporation (NDC) drew up a Master Plan for what was then called the Southern District. This mapped out what is now East and West Hunsbury and a road network feeding into Rowtree Road was built to handle the traffic expected from the new houses, schools and shops.

The NDC also decided that the area, around Wootton Brook and up to the M1, was unsuitable for building because of noise, flood risk and unstable land. This remained as open farmland or, as at West Hunsbury, landscaped parkland. Later, Collingtree Park, an International standard Golf Course with a limited number of low density houses was approved.

When the NDC was wound up in 1985, Northampton Borough Council continued with a similar planning approach and in 1997 the Northampton Local Plan noted that:

"There is generally no urban "sprawl" into the surrounding open countryside which is unusual for a town of the size of Northampton. It provides a real advantage in terms of identity for the town".

Over the years the area has not stood still. Collingtree Parish has doubled in size and Hunsbury and Wootton have grown along with the huge traffic increases on the M1, A45 and Junction 15.

Despite this planning history, the West Northamptonshire Joint Planning Committee (WNJPC) - a combination of councils from Northampton, Daventry and

other expansion plan build over 40,000 Member of Parliament for the area, have houses on several 'Sustainable Urban Extensions' on mainly greenfield sites 5, but have also said that if it is approved around Northampton.

If approved, SUE No 5 will allow 1000 houses (up to 40% 'affordable') on land bordering Wootton Brook and extending from the edge of Collingtree Village and through East Hunsbury almost to the Towcester Road (A43).

During the public consultation on this site there were 189 responses of which 185 raised concerns over flood risk, traffic congestion on Rowtree Road, landslip and air pollution.

In spite of these objections, the WNJPC has now sent its proposals to the government and there will be a full Public Examination before a Planning Inspector, starting in April.

Local Parish Councils, County and Bor-

all argued against the inclusion of SUE No by the Inspector, there should be no access to it from Rowtree Road or from Collingtree village. An alternative scheme has been suggested.

But, even before the Inspector has begun his work, Developer Bovis Homes Ltd has announced they are to make a Planning Application for 1,000 houses on the SUE No 5 site, with access from Rowtree Road and Windingbrook Lane.

Supporters argue that with a rising population and yet more immigration to come from eastern Europe, there is a severe housing shortage and more must be built.

Others point out that the real shortage is for low cost housing for first time buyers, close to central services and transport links and that Northampton town centre

has many brown field sites in need of regenera-

It will be for the Planning Inspector and then Northampton Borough Council to decide if the development of this Greenfield site will go ahead.


