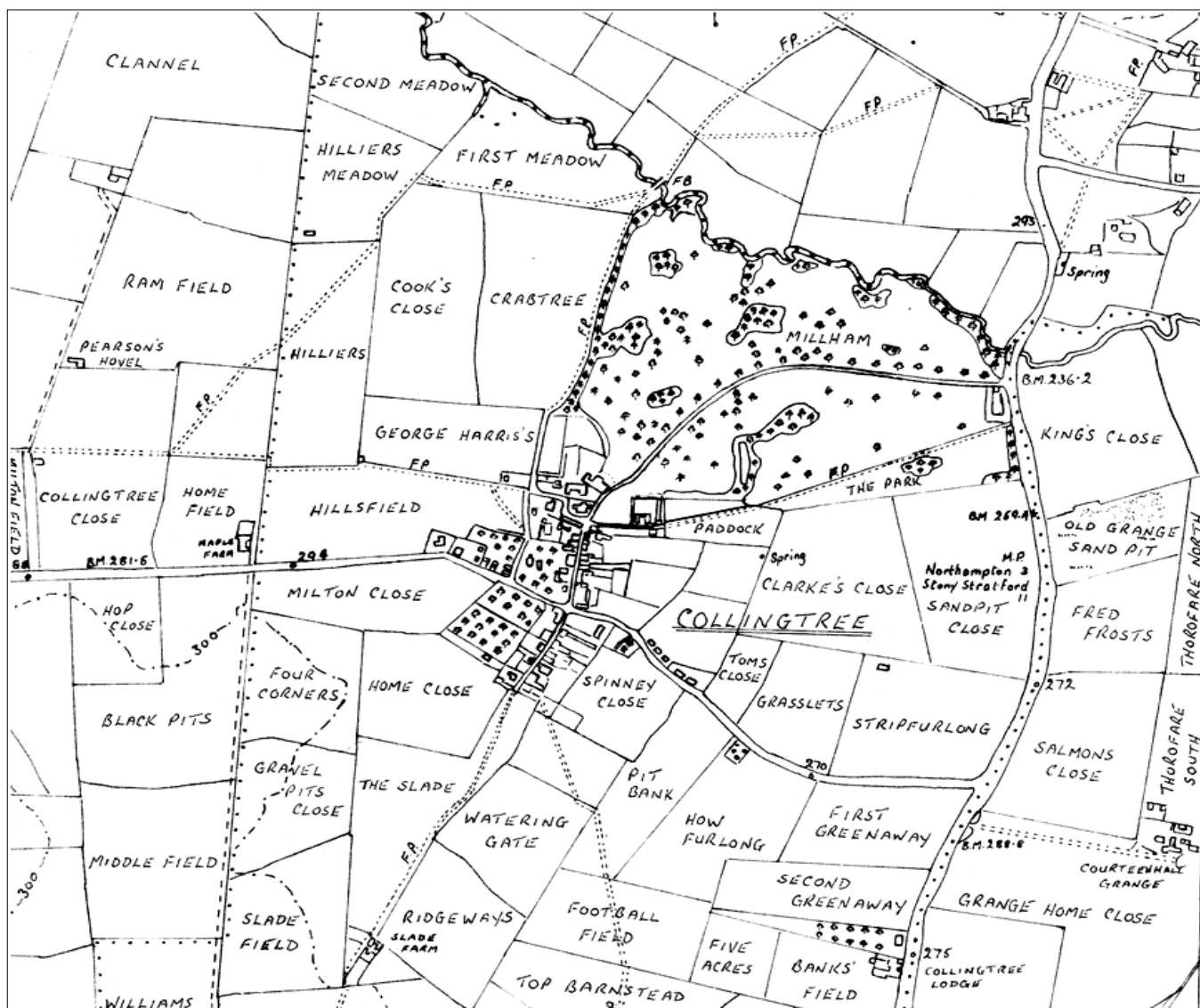

FORGOTTEN FIELDS

As more and more of Northamptonshire's green fields disappear under roads and housing developments, the old historic field names are being forgotten. Field names were once the only way that farmers could identify and organise their working land and names were generally based on the type of soil, natural flora and fauna, shape and size and archaeological links. *In 1939 all the field names around Collingtree were recorded by Jim Patrick on the map below.* Since the building of the M1 motorway in 1959, many of these fields are now outside the Collingtree parish.

Black Walk Bridle Path The law for bridle paths is that they are for horses and pedestrians. Cyclists may also use them but they have to stop and/or dismount if required to do so to meet the needs of primary users. Vehicles are prohibited. Better signage will be installed to make this clear

Park & Ride proposal There has been no further news on a proposal to allow Silverstone Circuits Ltd to use the land on Watering Lane for Park & Ride on Race Days. The Parish Council has already said that if any firm proposal is made, it will hold a Public Meeting.

Pedestrian Crossing, Watering Lane. HELP STILL NEEDED. The Parish Council can help, but funds from benefactors or fund raising, given to the Par-

ish Council or the school would show that the request is practically well supported by the local community and help to gain priority for our crossing.

Playing Field - Parking. The protective mesh was installed on the weekend of 5th/7th October and Tony and Grant from the Cricket Club are gratefully thanked for hammering home 500 clips between them. Please park in the field as complaints about cars on the footpath continue and the blocking of exit sight lines could cause danger, especially in the winter months. The field is now regularly being used by youth teams from Kislingbury and the hope is that a youth team from Collingtree could be added to these

teams. There seems to be a good basis for a very successful school side.
